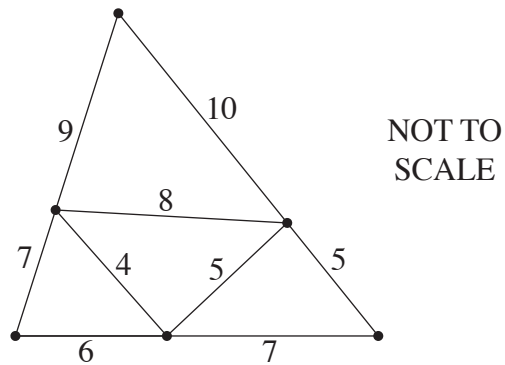

Calculate the amount of money Mina will save by purchasing only ten-litre cans of paint rather than only four-litre cans of paint.

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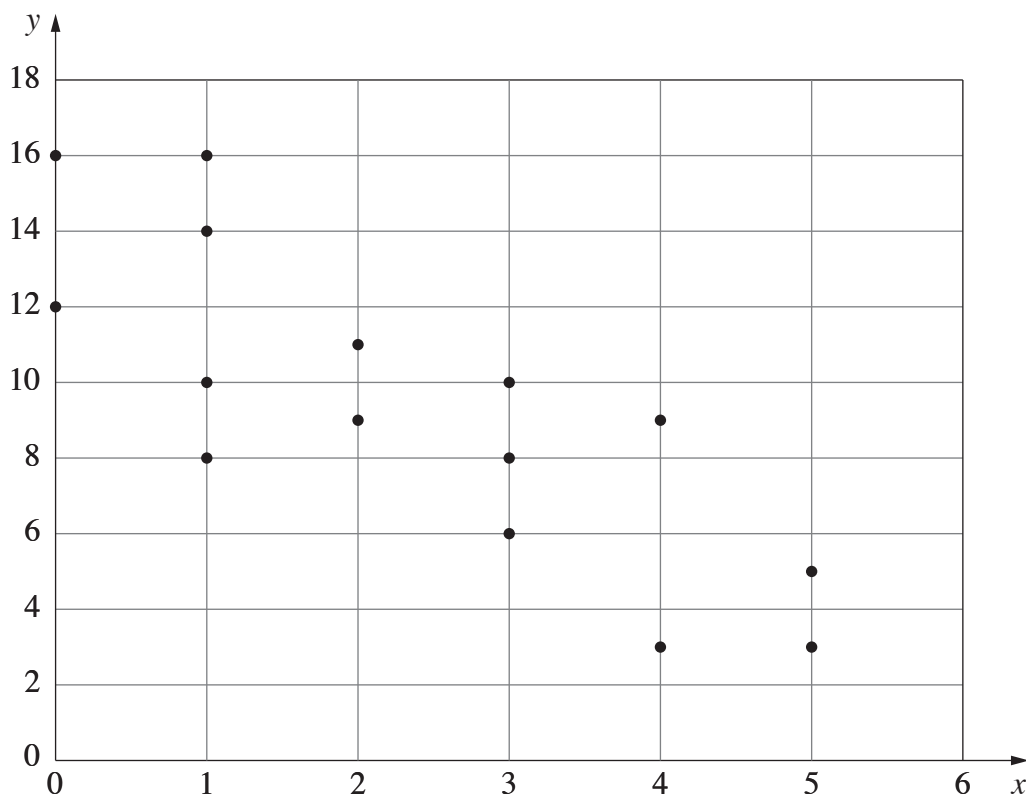
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Question 17 (3 marks)

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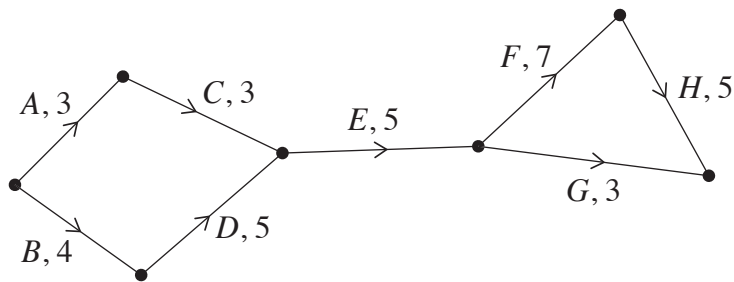

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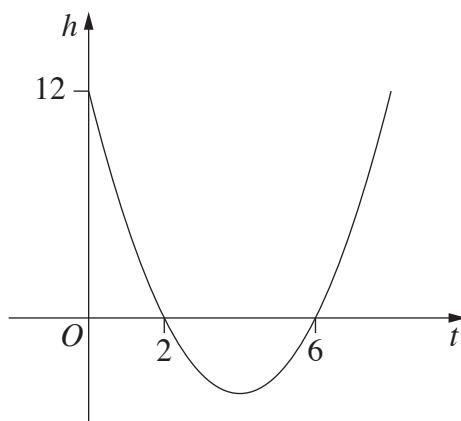

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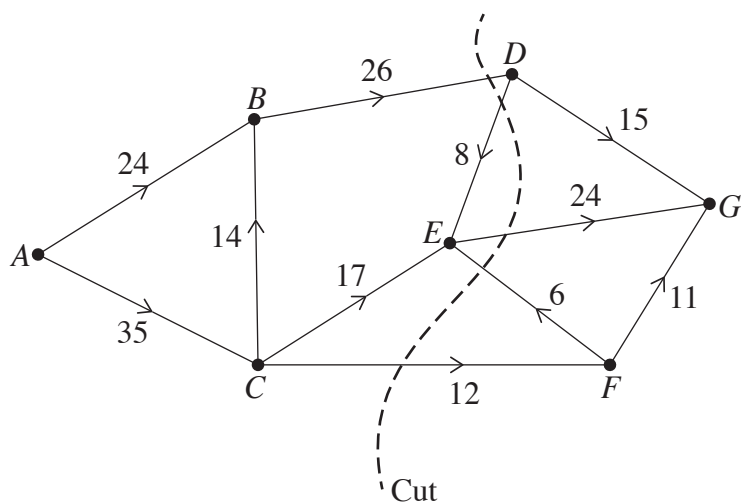

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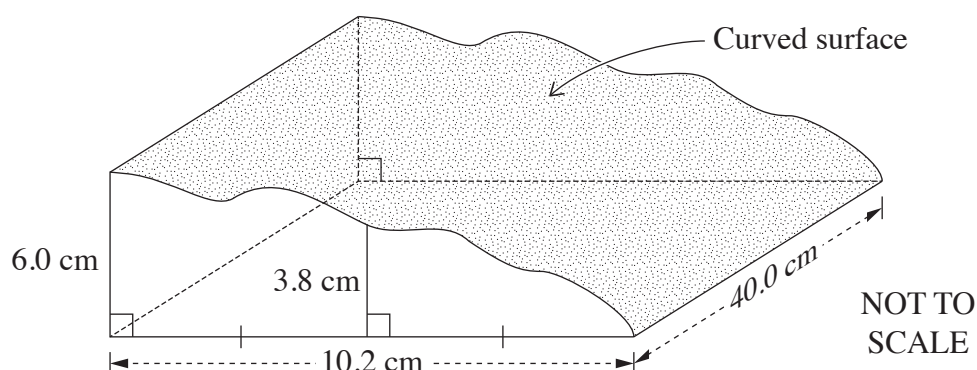

A credit card has an interest-free period of 45 days from and including the date of purchase. Interest is charged on purchases made, compounding daily at a rate of 13.74% per annum, from and including the day following the interest-free period.

Concert tickets were purchased for a total of \$392 using this credit card.

Full payment was made on the 68th day from the date of purchase. There were no other purchases on this credit card.

What was the total interest charged when the account was paid in full?

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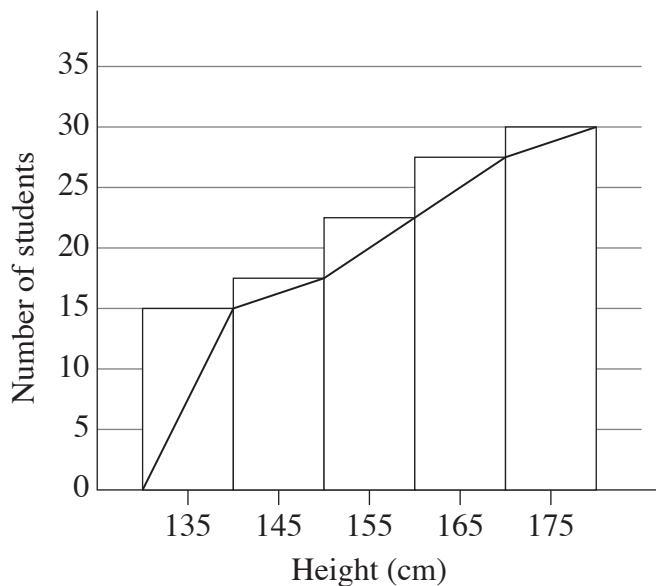

The heights of students in a class were recorded.

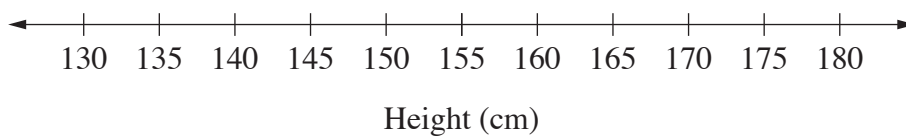

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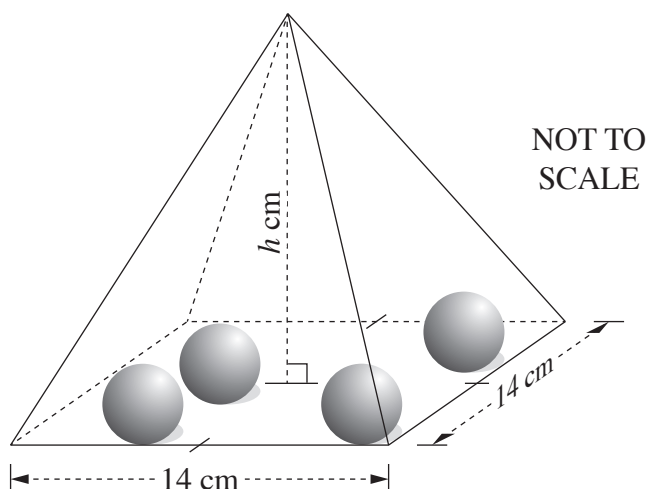
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Question 32 (3 marks)

Solid spheres are placed inside a square-based pyramid as shown.

The base of the pyramid has side lengths of 14 cm. The height of the pyramid is h cm. The radius of each sphere is 1.5 cm.

The amount of empty space remaining inside the pyramid after 30 spheres have been placed inside the pyramid is 634 cm^3 .

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Question 33 (5 marks)

A used car has a sale price of \$24 200. In addition to the sale price, the following costs are charged:

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- transfer of registration \$50
- stamp duty which is calculated at \$3 for every \$100, or part thereof, of the sale price.

Kat borrows the total amount to be paid for the car, including transfer of registration and stamp duty. Simple interest at the rate of 6.8% per annum is charged on the loan. The loan is to be repaid in equal monthly repayments over 3 years.

Calculate Kat's monthly repayment.

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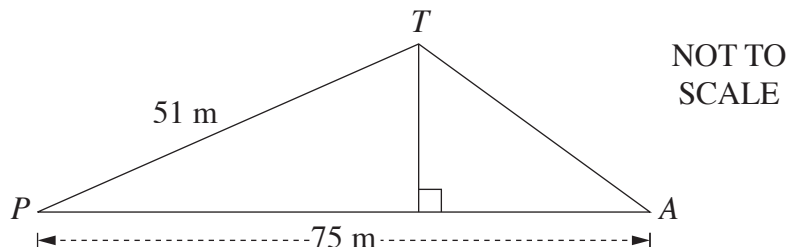

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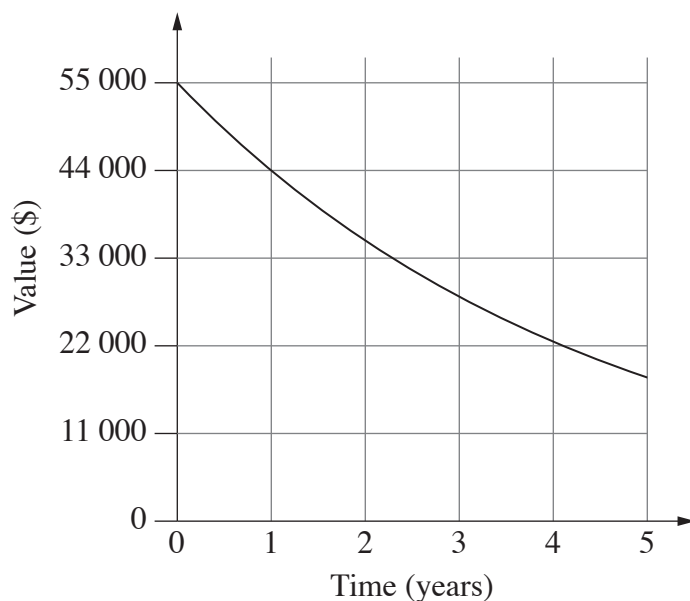

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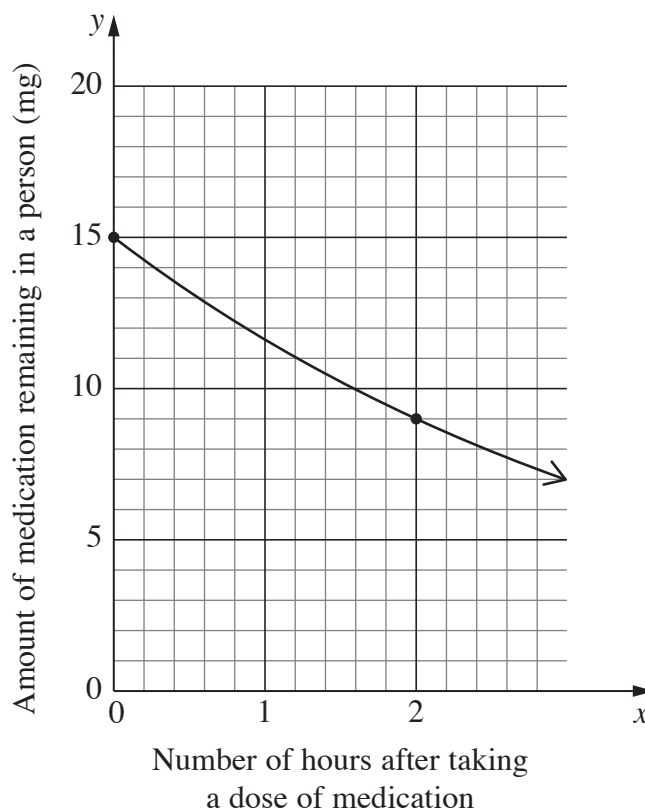
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Question 39 (3 marks)

The weights of the male sheep are normally distributed with a mean of 76.2 kg and a standard deviation of 6.8 kg.

In the flock, 15 of the male sheep each weigh more than x kg.

Find the value of x .

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- (b) The weights of the female sheep are also normally distributed but have a smaller mean and smaller standard deviation than the weights of male sheep.

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Explain whether it could be expected that 300 of the females from the flock each weigh more than x kg, where x is the value found in part (a).

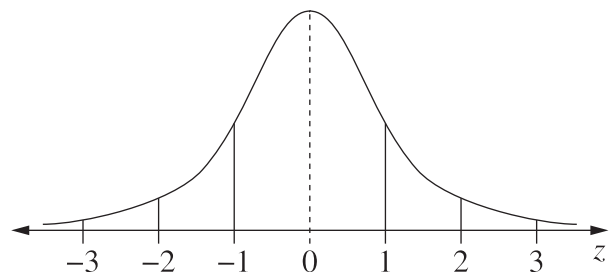

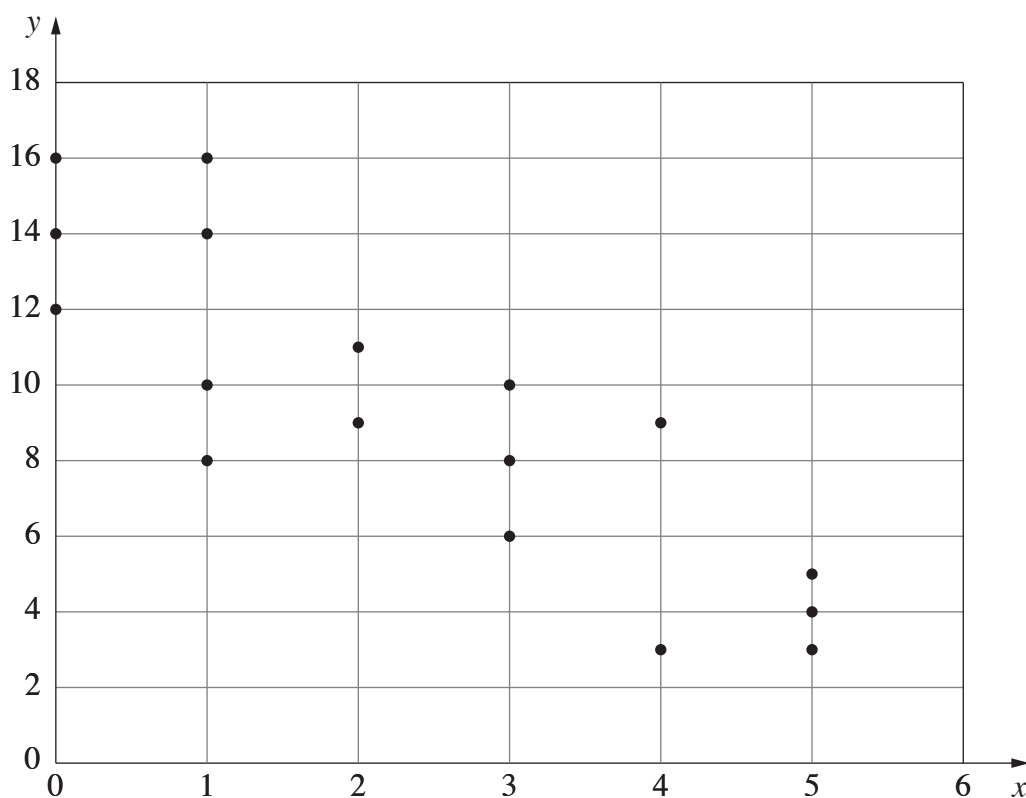

Question 25 (b)

• Provides correct interpretation of both slope and y-intercept	2

Sample answer:

Slope: For every 1 minute increase in time spent watching television per day the time spent exercising decreases by 0.7 minutes per day.

y-intercept: If someone doesn't watch television they are expected to exercise for 64.3 minutes per day.

Question 25 (c)

Sample answer:

$$y = 64.3 - 0.7x$$

$$y = 64.3 - 0.7 \times 42$$

$$= 34.9 \text{ minutes}$$

Question 25 (d)

Criteria	Marks
• Provides correct reason	1

Sample answer:

– 2 hours or 120 minutes of television suggests –19.7 minutes of exercise and can't do negative minutes of exercise.

Alternative answer:

– 2 hours or 120 minutes is outside the dataset so extrapolating is not reliable.

Sample answer:

$$A \approx \frac{5.1}{2}(6 + 3.8) + \frac{5.1}{2}(3.8 + 0)$$

$$\approx 34.68 \text{ cm}^2$$

Question 26 (b)

Criteria	Marks
• Provides correct solution	2
• Finds at least 2 correct areas as part of a surface area calculation, or equivalent merit	1

Sample answer:

$$1300 = (2 \times 34.68) + (10.2 \times 40) + (6 \times 40) + \text{curved surface}$$

$$1300 = 717.36 + \text{curved surface}$$

$$1300 - 717.36 = \text{curved surface}$$

$$582.64 \text{ cm}^2 = \text{curved surface}$$

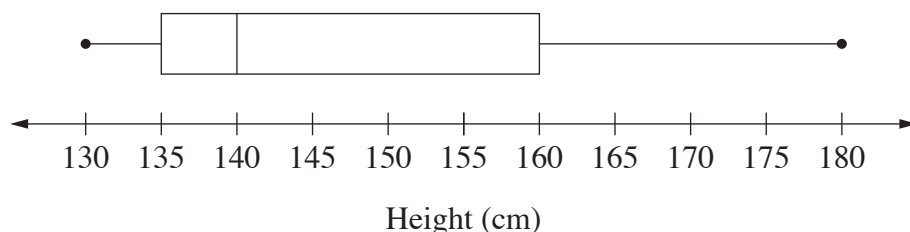

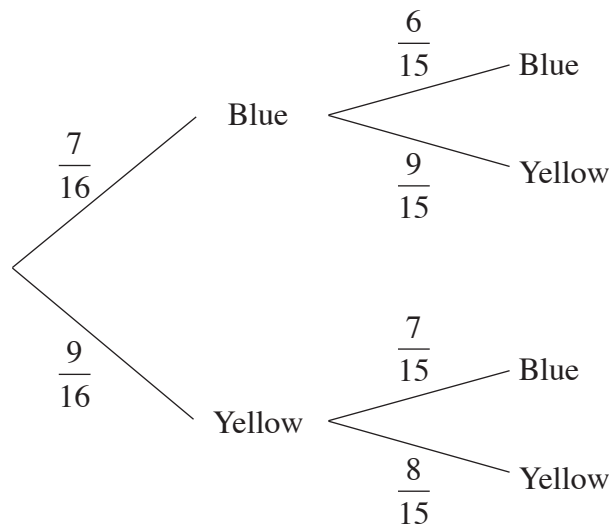
