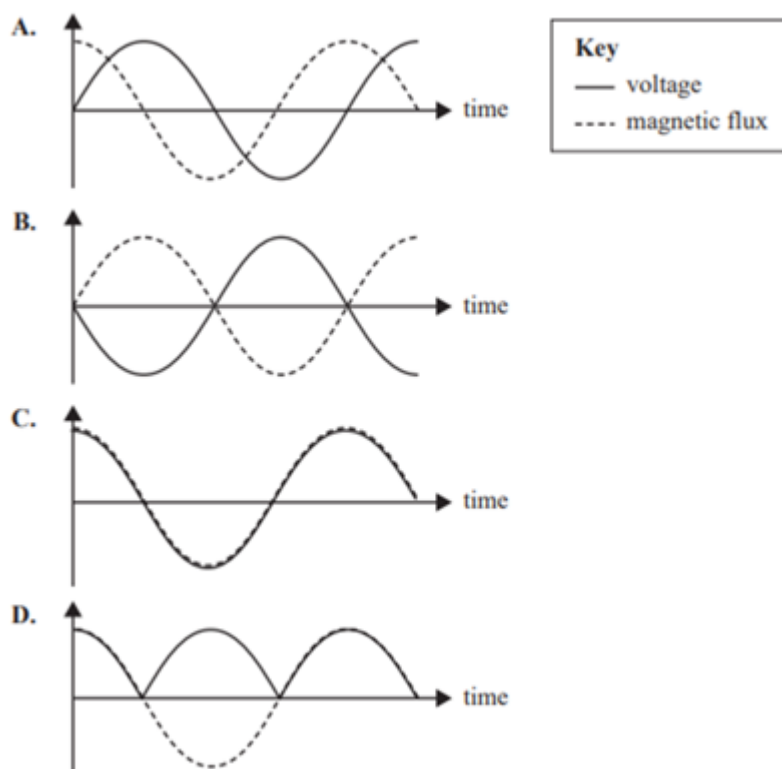

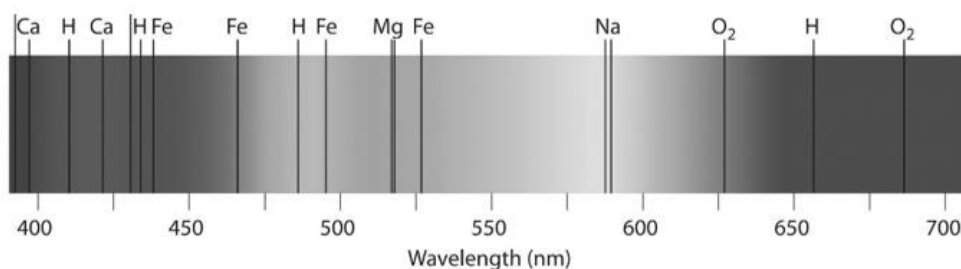

As part of an experimental investigation, Physics students use a pendulum, as shown below, to indirectly measure the magnitude of Earth's gravitational field at their location.



The students use a constant mass and a constant amplitude of swing, changing only the length of the pendulum and then measuring the time for five oscillations. They obtain four different time readings for four different lengths of the pendulum.

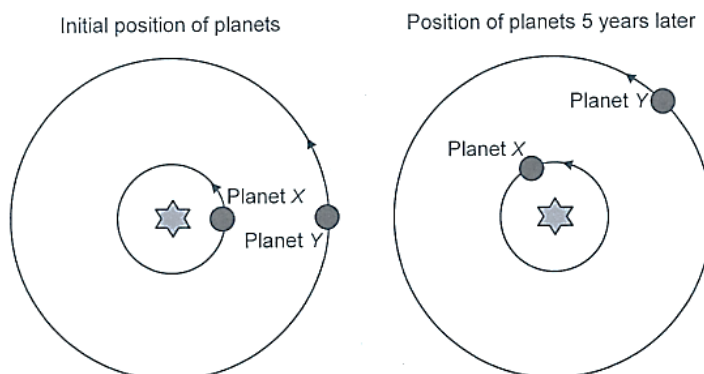

All other factors must be identified, accounted for, and controlled in the procedure. For an investigation to be reliable, the procedure must also be valid to prevent changes to the dependent variable from unknown or unaccounted for factors. Repeating an investigation may be a test of its reliability, but not necessarily its validity as an unaccounted for factor may be having the same effect on the observed results. 1 mark: Control variables (validity) 1 mark: Addresses aim – Independent variable and dependent variable. (validity) 1 mark: repeated, outliers removed, averaged (reliability) 1 mark: Relates an increase in precision, accuracy &/or reliability to the increase in validity. 23.	Explain why Einstein's description of the equivalence of energy and mass was critical for the acceptance of the Big Bang Theory.	2										
Explains the importance of $E = mc^2$ to the conversion of energy to matter in the BB theory (2 marks) Outlines BB theory or $E = mc^2$ (1 mark) The BB theory describes a singularity which is a concentrated point of energy. When this expands and cools energy is converted to matter. Einstein's description of the equivalence of energy and matter through his equation $E = mc^2$ provides an acceptable mechanism for this process. 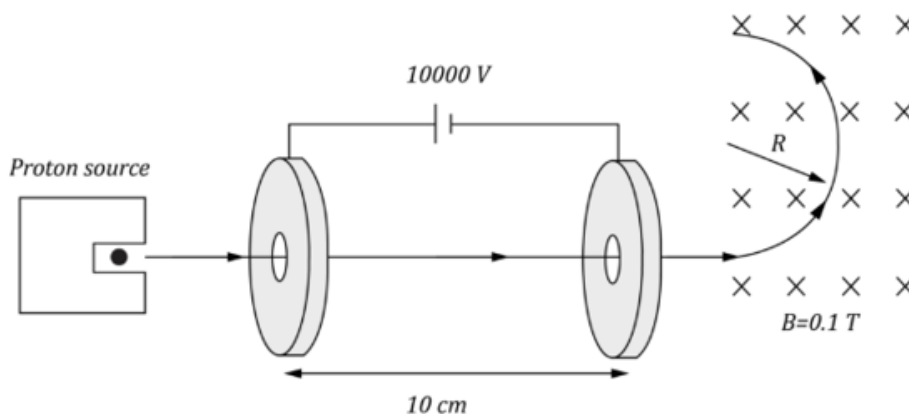

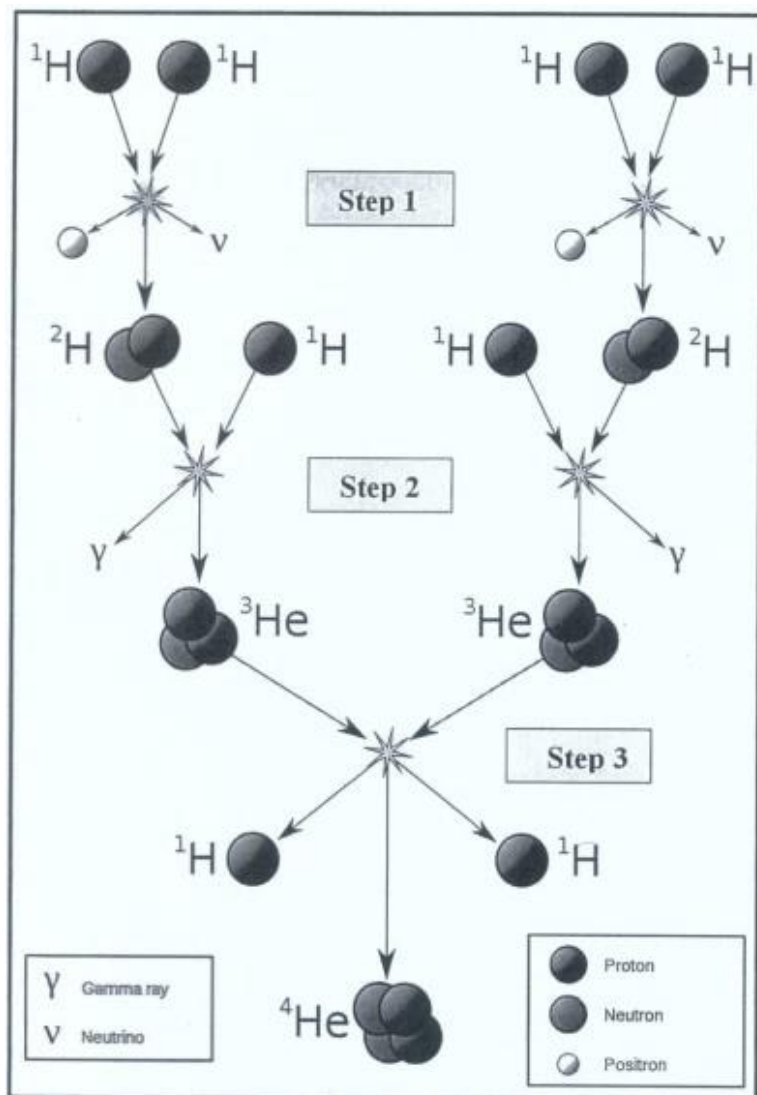

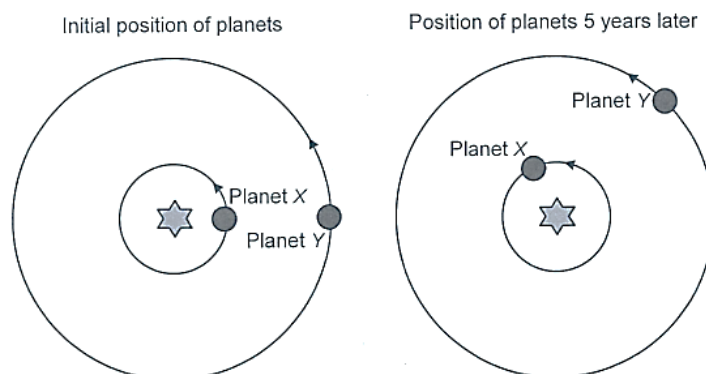

32. The diagram below demonstrates a possible mechanism for a braking system for trains. 4



Explain how this mechanism would work if the metal disc is made of aluminum.

In order to brake a current is applied to the coil creating a magnetic field. The rotating disc now experiences a changing flux which induces eddy currents in the disc. According to Lenz's Law these currents will be such that they oppose the change that is causing them. In this case the motion of the wheel. As a result the magnetic field associated with the eddy currents interacts with field of the electromagnet producing an opposing forces that slows the wheel.

Clear explanation linking cause and effect. Includes production of field, induction of eddy currents and relates the braking effect to Lenz's law. (4 marks) (must mention applying the brake)

33. Assess the impact of Einstein's work on our understanding of the nature of light.

Einstein's work had a very significant impact on our understanding of the nature of light.

Prior to Einstein light was thought to be wave but Einstein's work to explain the photoelectric effect reconceptualised light as a quantised particle.

The photoelectric effect is the emission of electrons from the surface of a metal when exposed to light. It had been observed that only light above a certain frequency would cause this to happen. Einstein explained this by suggesting that light consisted of particles (photons) whose energy was proportional to their frequency and that electrons could only observe all or nothing from a single photon.

Einstein's theory of special relativity postulated that the speed of light was constant. He was only able to show this mathematically and explain it with thought experiments but ultimately he was proven correct with significant experimental evidence.

Overall Einstein's work was critical in changing our understanding of light.

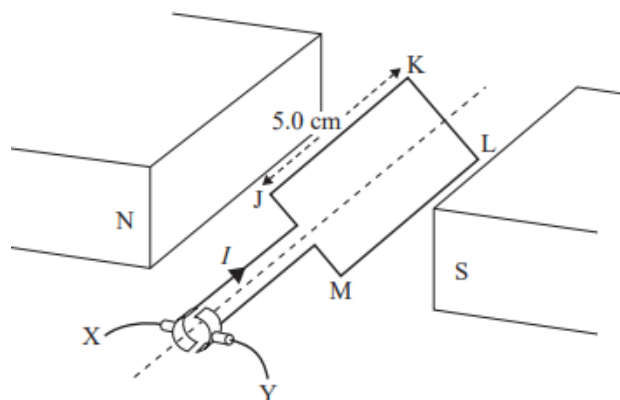

Referring to the work of Bohr and Rutherford in atomic physics, discuss how scientists use experimental observation and physical principles to improve scientific models.

Models are constructed to explain observations and create further predictions of behaviour. Bohr and Rutherford developed their respective models by using physical principals to explain experimental observations.

Gieger/Marsden fired alpha particles at thin gold and detected motion with a fluorescent screen.

Observations: most passed straight through some slight deflections and some bounced backward.

Rutherford understanding the principals of electrostatic repulsion (and elastic collisions) explained these results by developing a model that consisted of a positively charged nucleus orbited by negatively charged electrons. The dense positive nucleus accounting for the electrostatic repulsion of the alpha particles. (pic would be good)

Bohr could not account for the stability of the Rutherfords orbit because he understood the physical principal that moving charged particles radiate energy and should therefore lose energy. To explain this and improve upon Rutherford's model he proposed that the electrons exist in discrete energy level which don't radiate energy. These electrons still orbited a positive nucleus. (pic would be good) In order to explain the experimentally observed emission spectra of hydrogen Bohr adopted the newly proposed physical principal of quantised energy to suggest that electrons move from one level to the next by absorbing/emitting a quanta of energy.
